In relation to the concerns recently raised regarding the evolution of the energy tariff reflected in the March bill, Enel Colombia clarifies that the inflation data published by the Departamento Administrativo Nacional de Estadística consider not only the energy tariff (cost per kWh), but also household consumption levels.

Energy tariffs in Colombia are regulated by the Comisión de Regulación de Energía y Gas (CREG) and reflect the evolution of the costs of the different components of the electricity service, which are influenced by economic factors, fuel prices, and electricity market conditions.

With respect to the February tariff, applied to customers in the March bill, Enel Colombia clarifies that:

- In the month of January, customers were granted an extraordinary credit balance, for a single occasion, of 40 pesos per kWh, which led the tariff to become the lowest in the entire Colombian electricity market;
- In the month of February, said credit balance ceased to be applicable and the update of the costs of energy purchase contracts entered into force.

Even after this adjustment, Enel Colombia's tariff continues to stand below the market average, confirming itself as one of the most competitive nationwide, in addition to being more than 9 pesos per kWh lower compared to the same period of the previous year.

Regarding this matter, the Company has formally submitted detailed responses to the corresponding control and government entities, reiterates its strict compliance with the applicable regulation, and its willingness to clarify all information that may be necessary on this matter to the competent authorities.

Regarding the sanction imposed on Enel by the Superintendencia de Servicios Públicos Domiciliarios

This decision by the Superintendencia de Servicios Públicos Domiciliarios (Superservicios) is part of an investigation related to the energy offer submitted to the spot market by the Central Hidroeléctrica Betania between October 17 and 22, 2022, and has no relation whatsoever to the tariff reflected in the March 2026 bill.

The Company timely addressed all the requirements of the authority and reaffirms that, in its operational decisions, it applies the regulations in force and complies with the rules established for the generation activity, always seeking a reliable, economical, and safe operation.

Enel reiterates that it respects the decisions of the authorities and that, as it always does, it will continue acting transparently, within the framework of the regulations in force.
